

# Contents

This is a test of having the same work<sup>1</sup> mentioned twice in the same document.

If there is only one citation in the paper, then it thinks it can ignore the author altogether, except in the bibliography, so I had to include another work<sup>2</sup> which may help.

Perhaps the problem is being caused by putting in the footnote manually. But I don't want to have the author's name in the main body of the text.

If I don't put the citations in the footnote style<sup>3</sup>, the author names are put in the sentences.
