I have amended this test document per Nick's suggestions<sup>1</sup>. Namely, I have taken out the letter p before the page number. I have also taken out the carat for the footnote marker.

This is a test of having the same work<sup>2</sup> mentioned twice in the same document.

If there is only one citation in the paper, then it thinks it can ignore the author altogether, except in the bibliography, so I had to include another  $work^3$  which may help.

Perhaps the problem is being caused by putting in the footnote manually. But I don't want to have the author's name in the main body of the text.

If I don't put the citations in the footnote style,<sup>4</sup> the author names are put in the sentences.

This is a test of having the same work, 5 mentioned twice in the same document.

Here is an example<sup>6</sup> of the way I used to have it, namely with the letter p and with the carat for the footnote marker. You'll see in the footnote that the old problem is still there (double commas) if I use the old formatting. Thanks to Nick, Jesse for their help.

Here is the command I issued. No pdf template needed.
